## OVERNIGHT BACKPACKING TRIP Paynes Prairie Preserve State Park

## AFRICAN AMERICANS IN FLORIDA'S CULTURAL TOURISM Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Historic State Park

Date: Saturday, November 4th, 2006. 2:00 p.m.

**Description:** Sherry Sherrod DuPree, archivist and social historian, is adding a new dimension to the understanding of Florida's past that so fascinates those who visit historic sites like the Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Historic State Park. With her associates Garlenda Greene Grant and Patti Bartlett, Sherry DuPree recently interviewed many descendents of pioneer African American families in Alachua County and Marion County, gathering their personal recollections, their recipes and remedies, and stories of their work life, home life, holidays and school days, weddings and funerals, church and social affiliations, and much more. Sherry DuPree and Garlenda Greene Grant will present a program based on their research on regional African American history at the Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Historic State Park. There is no charge for this program.

African Americans like Idella Parker and Martha and Will Mickens, who worked for Marjorie Rawlings, were part of a great web of social and family kinship that most of us are just learning about. Using oral history, census data, cemetery records, and other documents, DuPree and her team are revealing intriguing insights about the lives of blacks on the Dudley Farm, the Haile Plantation, and in small towns and rural communities such as Cross Creek. DuPree, who is known for her literary presentations, has curated exhibits on Gospel Music Performers and the 1923 Rosewood Massacre in Levy County. She helped with the research on the Tenant House moved to the Rawlings site in 2002 and for that project

interviewed Idella Parker, whose role as Mrs. Rawlings "Perfect Maid" is well known.
