RUSSIAN EGG DECORATING

--Art and Traditional Feast Food Celebrate Russian Orthodox Easter--

The traditional art of Ukrainian or Russian decorated eggs will be taught in a class on April 15 at Stephen Foster Folk Culture Center State Park.

Russian decorated eggs bear elaborate and colorful designs created with a wax-resist dyeing process. Literally, the eggs are "written upon" rather than painted because the designs represent hopes for fertility, good health, and wealth. Traditionally, the elaborately decorated eggs were given away to others with good wishes for the coming year.

The class commemorates the observance of Russian Orthodox Easter and will

include traditional refreshments. Jean Davidoff, an artist whose work also includes pottery and culinary arts, will teach the class and prepare traditional foods for the Easter feast. A round, cylindrical bread customarily baked and eaten at Easter with kielbasa, Russian tea, and the sweet creamy spread known as paska will be served to students in the class.

The class will be held at Nelly Bly's Kitchen and is free with regular park admission of \$4 for a vehicle with up to 8 passengers. There is no additional fee for the refreshments and all class supplies will be provided by the instructor.
