From hawks and gopher tortoises to owls and possums, up close and personal is the way Leslie Straub cares for the injured Florida wildlife that find their way to her combination hospital and rescue mission. Join Leslie and her animal friends at the Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Historic State Park on Saturday, May 19, at 10:30 a.m. your own close encounter with wild Florida as Leslie introduces some of the creatures she has rescued and tells us how we can help preserve their native habitats.

Leslie is the Director of Florida Wildlife Care, Inc., an organization dedicated to the care and conservation of native wildlife and habitat in Florida. She has helped rehabilitate and release hundreds of injured and orphaned wildlife such as this red-tailed hawk that was the star of the show at her visit to the Rawlings farm last year.

This program is sponsored by the *Friends of the Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Farm, Inc.* Afterwards, stroll around the grounds and meet our resident ducks and chickens and treat yourself to a guided tour of the Rawlings home for a glimpse of the Cracker lifestyle that the author shared with us in *The Yearling, Cross Creek* and her other books.

The Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Historic State Park is free and open to the public 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. seven days a week. There is a \$2.00 per car load entrance fee. The Rawlings House is open for guided tours from October through July on Thursday through Sunday.
