Directions: Traveling East on I-10 to new Exit 196 (old Exit 28). Take SR-263 (Capitol Circle) South 12 miles. Turn right (South) onto US-319/SR-61 (Crawfordville Hwy) for 2 miles. Bear left onto SR-61(Wakulla Springs Rd) for 6 miles. Turn left onto SR-267 at flashing stop light. Turn Right into Park entrance. From West I-10 use new Exit 203(old Exit 30). Take SR-61 (Thomasville Rd) South. Continue on SR-61 thru Tallahassee for 10 miles. Take US-319/SR-61 (Crawfordville Hwy) South for 2 miles. Bear left onto SR-61(Wakulla Springs Rd) for 6 miles. Turn left onto SR-267 at flashing stop light. Turn Right into Park entrance.

6TH MARION COUNTY SPRINGS FESTIVAL

Rainbow Springs State Park

Date: Saturday, September 22, 2007. 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.

Description: This year the Marion County Springs Festival will feature seminars with state and local freshwater spring's experts giving updates on the health of Florida's aquifer system, dozens of water conservation-oriented exhibits, live music, swimming in the Rainbow River, student art show, storytelling and more.

Educating Marion County residents and visitors about Florida's freshwater springs is the goal of the 6th Marion County Springs Festival. Representatives from the Florida Springs Initiative, St. Johns River Water Management District, Southwest Florida Water

Management District, Florida Geological Survey, Marion Soil & Water Conservation District, Marion County Planning Department and Wetland Solutions and others will be featured.

This year's Festival will also offer a wide variety of educational and entertainment venues including a series of interactive booths on the Florida aquifer, water wise landscaping tips, arts and crafts vendors, food and beverage concessions, hiking in beautiful botanical gardens, a photography contest, live bands and a "Spring Song" contest.

Directions: From I-75, exit at the second Ocala exit onto State Road 40. Take State Road 40, west. Drive until it dead-ends at U.S. 41. Turn left, the park entrance is on the left-hand side of the road. From Tampa, take U.S. 41, north. Drive through the town of Dunnellon. The park is located on the right-hand side of the road, approximately 2.5 miles north of Dunnellon. From areas in the northwest, take U.S. 41 to the town of Williston. After passing through Williston, you will come to a traffic light where State Road 40 has come to a dead-end. Go through this light; the park entrance is on the left-hand side of the road. The campground is separate from the headsprings day use area and is located 2.5 miles north of C.R. 484 off of S.W. 180th Avenue or 2.5 miles south of Highway 40 off of S.W. 180th Avenue.

KID'S BIRDING WORKSHOP

Faver-Dykes State Park

Date: September 29 2007, 8:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m.

Description: The Friends of Faver-Dykes State Park will be offering a Kid's Birding Workshop. A Ranger and a member of the Audubon Society will illustrate some of the techniques birders use to observe and identify types of birds and the importance of conservation for their habitat. Participants will learn to identify song and wading bird species commonly seen in this area, and will learn how to use identification guides and binoculars. Each workshop will be hands-on with participants viewing along the banks of Pellicer Creek while applying their newly learned skills. Participants will also be constructing their own wooden bird house to take home with them. All gear will be furnished for each participant to use during the 4 hour workshop. Upon completion of the workshop each participant will be awarded a certificate of completion, a souvenir birding packet, and their very own newly constructed bird house to take home. Spaced are limited and advance registration is required by September 22nd.
