Experience History at Battle Reenactments

Join us Saturday, December 29 and Sunday, December 30 at <u>Dade Battlefield Historic State</u> <u>Park</u> in Bushnell for the annual reenactment of the battle that started the 2nd Seminole War. Seminole Indian warriors ambushed 108 soldiers at this site in 1835.

Take a stroll down the Old Fort King Road, visit soldiers in their camp, view Native American crafts in the Seminole camp, walk through the Sutler's Row, watch demonstrations of skills such as blacksmithing, or kick back and enjoy the period music that fills the air. The highlight of the weekend is the battle reenactment, which takes place at 2 p.m. each day.

Two Civil War battle reenactments will occur in February and March.

- The **Battle of Olustee** will be reenacted on February 15-17.
- The **Battle of Natural Bridge** will be reenacted on March 1 & 2.
