### **Getting Fit**

Hiking and bicycling are good aerobic activities. Start the new year by taking a 12-mile **hike** at <u>Suwannee</u> <u>River State Park</u> on January 1. Go for a 50-mile **bicycle ride** at <u>San Felasco Hammock State Park</u> on January 12. On January 19, there will be a guided overnight backpacking trip at <u>Lake Kissimmee State Park</u>.





### **Exploring Nature**

Learn about the endangered manatee during **Manatee Awareness Month** at <u>Manatee Springs State Park</u>. Activities continue throughout the month of January.

On Friday, January 25, <u>Myakka River State Park</u> will host the second in a series called **Moon Over Myakka Owl Prowl**. Go on an evening hike to find owls actively feeding their young. The series continues in February and March.

**Saturday, January 5** ... Dorvan Daniels will present the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission rescue boat and discuss the agency programs that protect and rescue manatees.

**Saturday, January 12** ... Chassahowitzka National Wildlife Refuge personnel will present manatee rescue slides (approximately 30-40 slides) inside their portable dark room. The room will hold about 4 people at a time.

**Saturday, January 19** ... Save the Manatee Club will be at the amphitheater with photographs and brochures on manatees and provide information on what this important organization does.

**Saturday, January 26** ... Sirenia Project, United States Geological Survey, Florida Integrated Science Center is a federal program whose scientists study the lives and travel patterns of manatees. They will set up their display at the river pavilion at end of the boardwalk. Their program includes a children's game oriented to identifying individual manatees.

#### 2008 TOUR DE FELASCO

San Felasco Hammock Preserve State Park

**Description:** Join the Friends of San Felasco CSO for a 50-mile mountain bike tour through one of North Florida's most diverse ecological and geological preserves, San Felasco Hammock Preserve State Park. The Tour is NOT a race, but rather a challenging series of trails opened specially for the event that will test your bike skills and endurance with rolling hills, short climbs, sinkholes, hydric hammock and prairie. Participants will face all of the challenges that North Florida riders have come to expect from the San Felasco trails, but on a truly epic proportion. Participants will be able to ride a full 50 miles without crossing a single paved road: approximately 20 miles of singletrack, 15 miles of doubletrack, and 15 miles of horse and hiking trails. Experience areas of the park open to bikes only for the Tour, while supporting the CSO's efforts to improve this magnificent trail system.

The park will be on the left. From I-4, West bound take Exit 10 go north on County Road 579 to U.S. 301. Follow the signs and go north 7 miles. The park will be on the left. From I-4, East bound take Exit 7 (be careful of the merges) and go north on U.S. 301 for 14 miles. The park will be on the left.
