The park will be on your left-hand side.

THE BATTLE OF NATURAL BRIDGE

Natural Bridge Battlefield Historic State Park

Date: Saturday & Sunday, March 1 & 2, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Description: The Department of Environmental Protection's Natural Bridge Battlefield Historic State Park, in partnership with the Natural Bridge Historical Society, The Leon Rifles and the United Daughters of the Confederacy, will host the 143rd annual Battle of Natural Bridge. The event commemorates the 1865 Civil War confrontation that preserved Tallahassee as the only Confederate capital east of the Mississippi River to avoid Union control. March 1: Event guests will mingle with civil war reenactors and observe a Confederate-Union

skirmish, cavalry demonstrations, artillery shows and medical treatment examples. March 2: The official Opening Ceremonies and Dedication, sponsored by the United Daughters of the Confederacy, will begin at 1:45 p.m., followed by a full-scale reenactment of the Battle of Natural Bridge at 2:30 p.m. Refreshments, including hamburgers, hotdogs, snacks and soft drinks will be available both days at 12:00 p.m.

THE WAY WE WERE: FORTS, FRONTIERS, AND FAMILIES

Hillsborough River State Park and Fort Foster State Historic Site

Date: Saturday, March 8, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Description: Fort Foster Historic Site will be hosting Archaeology Day. Florida Archaeology Month 2008 focuses on the significance of fortifications and defensive structures in Florida. Some Native Americans put up defensive walls around their villages for protection from other tribes. When Europeans first arrived in Florida, most of the forts were erected out of earth or wood – plentiful materials at hand for quick construction and defense. Later fortifications would be built out of more permanent material like stone, brick or concrete. They were constructed to protect harbors, rivers, strategic locations or centers of population. Many towns in Florida got their name from forts and numerous forts still exist today. Florida Archaeology Month is coordinated by the Florida Anthropological Society and supported by a grant from the Florida Division of Historical Resources. Additional sponsors include the Florida Archaeological Council, Florida Public Archaeology Network, Florida State Parks, state and local museums, historical commissions, libraries and public and private school systems.
