Earth Day

Earth Day is observed worldwide on April 22 to draw attention to the environmental health of our planet. Events will be held at many state parks.

On April 12, <u>Bahia Honda State Park</u> in the Florida Keys will celebrate Earth Day with live music, food, face painting, puppet shows and more.

On April 19, four parks will celebrate Earth Day. Hillsborough River State Park north of Tampa will hold a Great American Cleanup for volunteers to pick up litter along the river and in the park. Honeymoon Island State Park in Dunedin will host Island Earthdays highlighting the parks, birds, animals and environment that make barrier islands special. A 5K Trail Run will start the day at Highlands Hammock State Park west of Sebring. The day will continue an exotic removal activity, t-shirt painting and live music. At Koreshan State Historic Site in Estero, the local chapter of the Sierra Club will bring music, food, demonstrators and exhibitors to celebrate the day.

The <u>Barnacle Historic State Park</u> in Coconut Grove will celebrate with a festival on April 27 with music, fun and exhibits.
