Suwannee River Wilderness Trail

The <u>Suwannee River Wilderness Trail</u> stretches 170-miles from White Springs to the Gulf of Mexico. Along the famed spring-cooled river, visitors can enjoy paddling, hiking, biking and horseback riding. Take an opportunity to explore the Suwannee's wilderness, its parks, its towns and its historic sites. Sleep under the stars, at a river camp, in a cabin, at a local motel or bed and breakfast.



Four <u>river camps</u> are located approximately 10 miles from established parks and campgrounds on the river. Each river camp features five screened sleeping platforms with electricity and ceiling fans, restrooms and showers and primitive camping sites for tents. River camps are accessible from the river. Outfitters can work with visitors to deliver gear, coolers and catered food to the river camps.

TURTLE TALK: A SEA TURTLE'S JOURNEY

Gamble Rogers Memorial State Recreation Area at Flagler Beach

Date: Friday, May 2, 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

Description: Join a Park Ranger to learn about the life journey of a sea turtle. Sea turtle nesting season begins May 1. Participants will learn how they can enjoy the beach while helping to protect these ancient creatures. Participants will discover the park's role in ensuring the future of sea turtles. Participants will also learn about the different species that frequent Florida beaches, the life cycle of a loggerhead sea turtle and the perils sea turtles face throughout their journey through life.

Directions: From I-95: Exit I-95 at exit 284 (State Road 100). Turn east onto State Road 100 and travel approximately three miles till you reach A1A (and the ocean). At the light, turn right (south) and travel approximately three miles. The ranger station will be on the drive to your right and our day use beach facilities will be on the left. **From Daytona:** Take A1A north to approximately one mile north of the Flagler/Volusia county line (approximately 18 miles). The ranger station will be on the drive to your left and our day use beach facilities will be to your right. From Ormond Beach: Take West Granada (40) east, across the Halifax River, to A1A. Turn left (north) on A1A and travel approximately 11 miles (one mile north of the Flagler/Volusia county line). The ranger station will be located on the drive to your left and our day use beach facilities will be to your right. From Palm Coast: Take Palm Coast Parkway east across the Intracoastal Waterway (toll bridge) to A1A. Turn left (south) on A1A and travel approximately 11 miles. The park is located on A1A. The ranger station will be on the drive to your right and our day use beach facilities will be to your left. Avoid the toll: Take Palm Coast parkway east to Colbert Lane. Turn right (south) on Colbert Lane and travel approximately seven miles to State Road 100. Turn left (east) on State Road 100 and travel approximately 1.5 miles to A1A. Turn right on A1A and travel about three miles. The ranger station will be on the drive to your right and our day use beach facilities will be to your left. From St. Augustine: Take A1A south for approximately 32 miles to State Road 100. Continue straight through the light and travel approximately three miles to the park. The ranger station will be located on the drive on your right and our day use beach facilities will be on your left.
