### Caladesi Island Is Best Beach in 2008

Just before Memorial Day weekend, Caladesi Island State Park was recognized as the number one beach in the nation by coastal geologist Dr. Stephen P. Leatherman, also known as "Dr. Beach."

The park is accessible only by boat or ferry from Honeymoon Island State Park. Beach lovers can enjoy swimming, sunbathing and beachcombing, while saltwater anglers can fish from their boats or throw a line out into the surf. Nature enthusiasts can glimpse wildlife while hiking the three-mile nature trail through the island's interior or paddling a three mile kayak trail through the mangroves and bay. Picnic tables and shelters are located near the beach, and the park offers a marina with electric and water hookups for boaters.

Dr. Beach's "America's Best Beaches List" is an annual announcement made by Dr. Leatherman, director of Coastal Research at Florida International University in Miami. Leatherman's yearly survey highlights the top destinations from his tour of 650 major public recreational beaches, evaluating beaches based on 50 different factors, including water color and temperature, sand color and softness, public access and area wildlife and vegetation.

#### MATTIE KELLEY CHOCTAWHATCHEE ESTUARY FESTIVAL

Fred Gannon Rocky Bayou State Park

Date: Sunday, June 1, 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

**Description:** The Department of Environmental Protection's Fred Gannon Rocky Bayou State Park, the Friends of Emerald Coast State Parks, Inc. and the Mattie Kelley Environmental Institute will host the 1st Annual Choctawhatchee Estuary Symposium. The goal for this event is to facilitate community interest and involvement in our local watershed's environment. The event will consist of family-geared activities, such as fish printing on T-shirts and crab races. Informative displays and lectures, such as a historic look at the Choctawhatchee River and Bay and a habitat restoration project of the Okaloosa Darter, a locally threatened fish, will be available. Other displays will focus on local snakes, Red Tide, Sturgeon population and drinking water nitrate testing. Rocky Bayou presents an ideal setting to also include several guided botany and bird watching nature walks along the hiking trails. Additionally, guided kayak tours and lead seining exercises for kids to examine local fish will be offered at the shore.

#### TURTLE TALK: A SEA TURTLE'S JOURNEY

Gamble Rogers Memorial State Recreation Area at Flagler Beach

**Description:** Join a Park Ranger to learn about the life journey of a sea turtle. Sea turtle nesting season began May 1st. Participants will learn how they can enjoy the beach while helping to protect these

ancient creatures. Participants will discover the park's role in ensuring the future of sea turtles. Participants will learn about the different species that frequent Florida beaches, the life cycle of a loggerhead sea turtle and the perils sea turtles face throughout their journey through life.

**Directions: From I-95**: Whether traveling north or south on I-95, take Exit # 284 (State Road 100). Turn east onto State Road 100 and travel approximately three miles to A1A (and the ocean). At the light turn right (south) and travel approximately another three miles. The Ranger Station will be located on the drive to your right and our day use beach facilities will be on the left.

From Daytona: Take A1A north to approximately one mile north of the Flagler/Volusia County line (approximately 18 miles). The Ranger Station will be located on the drive to your left and our day use beach facilities will be to your right.

From Ormond Beach: Take West Granada (40) east, across the Halifax River, to A1A. Turn left (north) on A1A and travel approximately 11 miles (one mile north of the Flagler/Volusia County line). The Ranger Station will be located on the drive to your left and our day use beach facilities will be to your right.

From Palm Coast: Take Palm Coast Parkway east across the Intracoastal Waterway (toll bridge) to A1A. Turn left (south) on A1A and travel approximately 11 miles. The park is located on A1A. The Ranger Station will be on the drive to your right and our day use beach facilities will be to your left. Avoid the toll: Take Palm Coast parkway east to Colbert Lane. Turn right (south) on Colbert Lane and travel approximately seven miles to State Road 100. Turn left (east) on State Road 100 and travel approximately 1.5 miles to A1A. Turn right on A1A and travel about three miles. The Ranger Station will be located on the drive to your right and our day use beach facilities will be to your left.

From St. Augustine: Take A1A south for approximately 32 miles to State Road 100. Continue straight through the light and travel approximately another three miles to the park. The Ranger Station will be located on the drive on your right and our day use beach facilities will be located on your left.
