Emerging Contaminants of concern (ECs) are defined as those chemicals or pathogenic microorganisms that are not commonly monitored, but have been shown to occur in the environment and may have the potential to represent an ecosystem or public health risk. These contaminants often originate from consumer products and by-products used every day in homes, on farms, or by businesses and industry. Emerging contaminants of concern include chemicals such as household cleaning products, fragrances, nonprescription and prescription drugs (including hormones), disinfectants, and pesticides; pathogens such as Helicobacter pylori and West Nile virus; and natural hormones excreted by humans or present in plants. There is a lack of data demonstrating ECs risk to public health.



This conference will provide a forum for presentations and discussions about the risks and effects of ECs, practical information about ECs, and potential solutions to the EC problems.

Conference Objectives

The intent of this conference is to bring together researchers, regulators, wastewater and drinking water treatment plant operators and managers, educators, policy makers, public health professionals, and the public for a balanced interdisciplinary forum on emerging contaminants of concern in the environment.

Our goals are:

- to present cutting-edge research on EC detection, environmental occurrence, transport, risk, and effects;
- to offer practical information about EC risk targeted at educators, health officials, and policy makers; and
- to introduce potential solutions to EC problems for wastewater and drinking water treatment professionals.
