We also do load checks at the landfill (150 per year) auditing commercial loads for improperly disposed commercial hazardous waste and, as Solid Waste employees, audit the same loads for percent of recyclables contained. Haz waste inspection staff also makes note of potential air emission violations, water quality issues (refer these) and provides recycling guidance to every potential generator we visit. We also provide support to the local Emergency Services HazMat team, oversee spill site remediation and investigate complaints.
