BUSINESS OWNERS AND HOBBYISTS...

you may be generating regulated wastes!

The following wastes may NOT be simply discarded into the trash or poured down the drain without first undergoing a waste determination. Federal, state and local regulations prohibit improper disposal.

- E-juice with any concentration of nicotine (expired, spilled, unusable, simply unwanted, etc.)
- E-cigarette devices (may be hazardous due to lead solder, chromium coils and/or nicotine residue)
- Empty containers or devices that once held nicotine or E-juice with any concentration of nicotine (this includes any plasticware or glassware used to measure or transfer nicotine or nicotine-containing liquids)

Note: empty containers that held nicotine are not legally "empty" – they CANNOT be disposed or recycled as plastic or as glass containers – they are regarded as acute hazardous waste due to nicotine residue. (see EPA Guidance Document – DeWitt, May 08 2015 – RCRA Online #14850)

- Spent coils and scrap wire these CAN be recycled through a metal recycler
- Spent rechargeable batteries (all contain heavy metals) – these CAN be recycled
- Rinse waters containing any concentration of nicotine may NOT be discharged to sewer, septic system or soil
