



40-hour OSHA Technician Level Course

Description

This **FREE** course provides technician level personnel on-scene with the skills needed to recognize, evaluate, and control an incident involving the release or potential release of hazardous materials. The focus of the course is on recognizing and evaluating a hazardous materials incident, organizing the response team, protecting response personnel, identifying and using response resources, implementing basic control measures, decision-making and protecting the public.

Emphasis is on the hands-on use of equipment and exercises for practically applying lecture information. Participants will wear self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA), fully encapsulating suits (Level A) and chemical splash gear (Level B). Individuals who are not participating in a respiratory protection and medical surveillance program should contact their employer and/or physician prior to attending this course.

Individuals who respond to hazardous materials incidents should meet the minimum requirement set forth under the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) 29 CFR 1910.120 paragraph 9 (q). Individuals should have awareness and operations levels prior to attending this course.

This training will allow participants to objectively demonstrate competency requirements of Florida State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) Guidelines for Hazardous Materials Training, meets and exceeds the OSHA 29 CFR 1910.120 requirement of training for a Hazardous Materials Technician. It also meets the training requirement of the National Fire Protection Association's (NFPA) Standard 472 *Standard for Competencies for Hazardous Materials Responders to Hazardous Materials/Weapons of Mass Destruction Incident (Edition 2010)* for a Hazardous Materials Technician.
